INSECTS

Walk around the lake and see if you can see these insects.

Don't forget to check inside the flowers or see them hovering over the lake.

DID YOU KNOW?

All insects have 3 parts.



The head, the thorax (middle) and the abdomen (the end).



WILDFLOWERS

Wildflowers, plants and fungi are the life support for all our wildlife and their colour and character light up our park.

How many of these wildflowers can you spot? Remember not to pick them! The park's wildlife need our wildflowers to survive.



DID YOU KNOW?

The dandelion flower's seeds can travel up to 5 miles!

TREES

The park is full of trees. Can you find these? Which one is your favourite?

The trees in the park are important.



BIRDS

Sit quietly around the lake. You might see some of these water birds.

The coot has feet with lobed flaps of skin which work like flippers.



If you listen carefully you can hear it patter over the water before taking off.


