

Asbestos awareness in your home

Overview

This leaflet is to provide information to you, the tenant, on asbestos containing materials (ACMs) that may be present within your home and to explain what the council is doing about it.

The council have developed an asbestos management policy to safely manage asbestos within its properties. Various steps have been created for instances when asbestos is identified, it becomes damaged, or disturbed.

Asbestos containing materials will have risk assessments carried out on them, and this is recorded within a management system at the council. The council make an assessment as to whether asbestos materials need to be removed from the property and, if any future works are planned that may disturb these materials, they will be removed prior to the works commencing to ensure that the property remains in a safe condition.

What is asbestos and where could it be in the home?

Asbestos is a naturally occurring material that has been mined from a number of countries around the world and used within a large number of building products. Asbestos has many uses and has been used within housing to give additional strength to building materials, for electrical and chemical insulating and also for fire protection.

In the UK asbestos has been completely banned for use and importation since 1999 with blue and brown asbestos being banned in 1972 and 1985 respectively. Properties constructed between the 1950s and early 1980s are most likely to have asbestos materials used in their construction.



Some typical locations where asbestos may be present within a domestic property are:



1. House Insulation: In wall and floor cavities, in lofts and in roof tiles.

2. Rainwater items: Roof gutters and down pipes.

3. Soffit Boards (roof overhang): Soffit boards sit behind facia at eaves level.

4. Water Tanks: Usually made of asbestos cement and often found in older houses (pre 1980).

5. Pipe Lagging: Asbestos insulation on pipes.

Textured Coating (e.g. Artex): May be found throughout houses on ceilings and walls

7. Bathroom: Toilet cisterns may contain asbestos-reinforced resin composite materials, bath panels may be asbestos insulation board or cement.

8. Insulation to floor voids.

9. Heater Cupboard: Heater cupboard around domestic boiler often contains asbestos insulating material as well as gaskets and seals to gas appliances.

10. Floor Tiles: Vinyl and thermoplastic floor tiles can contain asbestos. The tile backing may also contain asbestos paper.

11. Partition Walls.

12. Panels: On or inside fire rated doors.

13. Fuse Boxes:

14. External wall cladding and internal wall panelling: Both particularly around windows.

15. External structures: May including old garages and loose cement roofing, can all contain asbestos.

Is asbestos dangerous?

If asbestos remains undisturbed and is in a good condition then it does not present a health risk to people. It is sometimes safer to leave the material in place than to remove it. The risks from asbestos occur when the material becomes damaged or disturbed and asbestos fibres become airborne.

Exposure to asbestos fibres may cause asbestos related diseases but these types of diseases only usually occur in people who have worked or come into contact with asbestos over a number of years

ASBESTOS WITHIN YOUR HOME DOES NOT PRESENT A RISK IF IT REMAINS UNDISTURBED AND IN GOOD CONDITION



We are all exposed to low levels of asbestos because it was used so widely in buildings, machinery, vehicle brake linings and around the home. These background levels are not dangerous.

When is permission needed?

You will need permission for any of the following types of works on your property:

- Any addition or alteration to your properties fixtures or fittings e.g. replacing doors or kitchen units.
- Provision of an over bath shower or free standing shower unit.
- Any addition or alteration connected with providing services to the property e.g. installing a new gas fire, fitting wall lights etc.
- Undertaking any structural alterations such as removal of an internal wall or sub-dividing any room.

- Erecting external structures or decorations e.g. garages, conservatory, greenhouses, fencing, established hedge removal.
- Erecting a radio or television aerial or satellite dish. Note, satellite dishes cannot be fitted to flats.
- Constructing major garden features e.g. ponds, decking, and patio.

Your responsibilities as a tenant

While you are a tenant within a council property there are certain steps you should take to help prevent exposure to asbestos from any asbestos containing materials.

BE AWARE of the places that asbestos may be located.



THINK BEFORE YOU START any works in your property. Do you need permission?



If you are unsure about a material in your property **SEEK ADVICE** from the council.



If carrying out DIY work within your property, **AVOID ASBESTOS** materials.



If damage or disturbance occurs to asbestos, **MAKE CONTACT** with the Council immediately.



DO NOT attempt to CLEAN UP OR REPAIR any damaged asbestos.



DO NOT use a regular **BRUSH OR VACUUM CLEANER** which may make the harmful fibres airborne.



Steps to take if you have disturbed possible asbestos containing materials:

If you have disturbed or damaged a suspected asbestos containing material in your property you should take the following steps:

1. Stop what you are doing.

2. Isolate the area by closing the door (if possible) and remove yourself from the source of contamination (move outside). Contact Customer Services to advise them of the problem.



3. Try to give Customer Services as much information as possible as this will enable a suitable response to the issue.



4. If you have debris and/or dust on your clothing, remain where you are, isolate yourself from others, and wait for somone from the Council to arrive.

5. DON'T PANIC. We are professionals, and we will be with you to help as soon as possible.
